

This week in Early Years.....our topic is
Science Week (6.6.11)

<p>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</p>	<p>We will talk about rules, recapping on class and school rules and talking about why we have them. We will think about setting rules for the new Forest Schools area which we should be able to use soon. We will also think about how we should care for and look after the plants and our natural environment.</p>
<p>Communication, Language and Literacy Development</p>	<p>We will read an information book about plants as well as reading the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. We will continue to develop our blending skills in guided reading – don't forget to read regularly with your child at home and write 'Ready to Change' in their planners when you want a new book – they should be changing their books at least twice a week. We will be making a plant diary to show how our beans are growing. In phonics we will be recapping the phonemes and tricky words we know as well as practising blending adjacent consonants (<u>f</u>rog)</p>
<p>Mathematical Development</p>	<p>In Maths we will continue to add and subtract practically and write simple number sentences to show our work in subtraction. We will continue to read, write, order and count to numbers beyond 10. We will compare the heights of the bean plants and use a ruler to measure them.</p>
<p>Knowledge and Understanding of the World</p>	<p>We will talk about the changes in our bean plants over the holidays – don't forget to bring them back. We will investigate how we can change the items brought in by the children before half term. In ICT we will make a labeled picture of a plant.</p>
<p>Physical Development</p>	<p>In PE we will develop our use of games equipment through throwing and catching balls, beanbags and hoops and playing simple games. We will continue to safely explore the apparatus and how we can use it in gymnastics.</p>
<p>Creative Development</p>	<p>We will make bookmarks using the plants we pressed before half term. We will set up our new role play area – a garden centre.</p>
